


Recruit The Help You Need With The Personal Approach

Coffee

Is coffee good for you? Bad? The arguments go on and on, but a meta-analysis of 127 studies on the question by the University of Catania in Italy has found that drinking coffee is associated with the following health benefits:

- → Decreased risk of breast, colorectal, colon, endometrial and prostate cancers, among others, from 2-20 percent depending on the cancer type.
- → Five percent reduction in risk for cardiovascular disease.
- → An approximately 30 percent lower risk for both Type 2 diabetes and Parkinson's disease, thanks to coffee's ability to improve enzymes that regulate glucose and insulin metabolisms.

Coffee's natural antioxidants reduce free radicals that can damage cells and cause aging. It's also an anti-inflammatory that calms you down so you don't overact to stress.

One group that should avoid coffee, however, is pregnant women. Coffee, the study notes, can increase the risk of miscarriage.

Be Prepared To Invest In Creativity

Creativity and innovation are important to business success. Are you and your organization ready to devote the resources necessary to support it? If you want to foster a creative atmosphere in your organization, take these factors into account:

- Money. Innovation can't breathe in an atmosphere of budget cuts and downsizing. Yes, you may come up with creative ideas to get around lack of funds, but in the long run you won't get many practical ideas unless you're willing to spend cash on developing and testing them.
- ▶ Elbow room. Cramming people into tight little cubicles is no way to get their imaginations working. Give them room to move around: conference rooms to spread out in, windows to stare out of, and the freedom to work in different environments that spark new ideas and insights.
- Freedom. Part of this is related to the space issue—freedom to work in nontraditional surroundings. But more important is freedom to suggest changes and question assumptions. Don't challenge people to think creatively only to squash their ideas with "But that's not how we do things around here."
- ▶ Risk. Remember how many times Thomas Edison tested his first light bulb? You can't generate creative thinking if people don't feel comfortable taking chances and failing. You should tolerate intelligent risk—and even celebrate failure—if people are acting in good faith while trying to help the organization grow.

Explore Team Goals With A Simple Test

To encourage communication and trust between team members, try this exercise: Ask each team member to write on a 3x5 index card what he or she thinks the goals of the team are. Read the cards out loud, without identifying who wrote them, to give team members a taste of everyone's expectations.

Look For Your Best Opportunity To Thrive

Success depends on finding opportunity. You can't wait for opportunities to come along—you've got to actively seek them out. Whatever your career goals, target your next step by considering these factors:

- ◆ **Job market.** Does a labor shortage exist in your industry, or a related one? You may be able to take advantage of employers' needs for qualified and reliable experts.
- ◆ Growth. Are organizations expanding in your field? Find out what they're investing in and how you can contribute.
- ◆ Technology. Have new tools become available? If you can educate yourself on the latest tech, you may be in a position to help organizations put cutting-edge tech to work.
- ◆ Customers. Are any of your customers (or vendors) experiencing difficulties related to your industry? Solving problems for them can help your organization and position you as a go-to person for complicated issues.

A Key Question For Job References

One nonjudgmental question you're safe asking is, "Would you characterize [this person] as a team player, or one who works best on his or her own?"
